NAPLAN stands for National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy

It is a test that is taken all over Australia by all children in year 3,5,7 and 9.

It tests children's

Reading
Writing
Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation
Numeracy

The benefits of the NAPLAN test

Shows you and the school how your child is progressing with their learning. An individual report that show's your child's results and compares their performance against other Australian children in their year group.

Helps teachers and the school work out your child's areas of strength and where future focus is needed. Also how best to support or extend your child's learning.

Helps the Principal and our school to plan programs and provide resources and extra help for children who need it.

Encourage your child to fully read the question before answering. This is a way to make sure they do their best!
